## STATE OF MICHIGAN COUNTY OF MARQUETTE ORV ORDINANCE OF 2025

An ordinance adopted for the purpose of authorizing and regulating the operation of Off-Road Vehicles (ORVs) on roads in Marquette County for the purpose of providing penalties for the violation thereof, to provide for the distribution of public funds resulting from those penalties pursuant to 2008 PA 240, MCL 324.81131, and for the purpose of repealing the County's existing ORV Ordinance adopted on June 18th, 2013.

## THE COUNTY OF MARQUETTE ORDAINS:

**Section 1.** As used in this ordinance, the following definitions shall apply:

"ATV" or "All-Terrain Vehicle" refer to as defined by Michigan Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act 451, 324.81101(b)

"County" means the County of Marquette;

"Driver license" means an operator's or chauffeur's license or permit issued to an individual by the Secretary of State under Chapter III of the Michigan Vehicle Code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.301 to 257.329, for that individual to operate a vehicle, whether or not conditions are attached to the license or permit;

"Operate" refer to as defined by Michigan Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act 451, 324.81101(s)
ORV;

"Operator" refer to as defined by Michigan Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act 451, 324.81101(t)

"ORV" refer to as defined by Michigan Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act 451, 324.81101(u)

"Road" means a County primary or County local road as described in Section 5 of 1951 PA 51, MCL 247.655, and does not include State or Federal highways or rights-of-way;

"Road Commission" means the Board of County Road Commissioners for the County of Marquette;

"Safety Certificate" refer to as defined by Michigan Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act 451, 324.81101(v)

"Township" means an individual township within the County of Marquette;

- e) traveling single file except when overtaking and passing another ORV;
- f) when visibility is not substantially reduced due to weather conditions unless displaying a lighted headlight and lighted taillight;
- g) one-half (1/2) hour before sunrise until one-half (1/2) hour after sunset unless displaying a lighted headlight and lighted taillight;
- h) while displaying a lighted headlight and lighted taillight at all hours beginning January 1, 2010;
- i) while the operator and each passenger is wearing a crash helmet and protective eyewear approved by the United States Department of Transportation unless the vehicle is equipped with a roof that meets or exceeds standards for a crash helmet and the operator and each passenger is wearing a properly adjusted and fastened seat belt;
- j) with a throttle so designed that when the pressure used to advance the throttle is removed, the engine speed will immediately and automatically return to idle;
- k) while the ORV is equipped with a spark arrester type United States Forest Service approved muffler in good working order and in constant operation;
- pursuant to noise emission standards defined by law; and, consistent with all other applicable laws, rules, regulations and ordinances.
- Section 7. A child less than sixteen (16) years of age shall not operate an ORV on a Road in the County unless the child is under the direct visual supervision of an adult and the child has in his or her immediate possession a Michigan issued ORV safety certificate or a comparable ORV safety certificate issued under the authority of another state or a province of Canada.
- **Section 8.** Traveling in a golf cart refer to as defined by Michigan Vehicle Code 257.657a A golf cart that is operated as an ATV shall require an ORV registration.
- **Section 9.** Unless a person possesses a valid driver's license, a person shall not operate an ORV on a Road in the County if the ORV is registered as a motor vehicle and is either more than sixty-five (65) inches wide or has three (3) wheels.
- **Section 10.** Operation of ORV, prohibited acts, crash helmet and protective eyewear required; exception; assumption of risk, refer to as defined by Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act 324.81133.
- **Section 11.** Any person who violates this ordinance is guilty of a municipal civil infraction and may be ordered to pay a civil fine of not more than Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars.

**Section 12.** A court may order a person who causes damage to the environment, a Road, or other property as a result of the operation of an ORV to pay full restitution for that damage above and beyond the penalties paid for civil fines.

**Section 13.** The County Treasurer shall deposit all fines and damages collected under this ordinance into a fund to be designated as the ORV Fund. The County Board of Commissioners shall appropriate revenue in the ORV Fund as follows:

- a) Fifty (50%) percent to the County Road Commission for repairing damage to Roads and the environment that may have been caused by ORVs, and for posting signs indicating ORV speed limits, or indicating whether Roads are open or closed to the operation of ORVs; and,
  - b) Fifty (50%) percent to the County Sheriff for ORV enforcement and training.

**Section 14.** This Ordinance shall become effective the day following publication of notice of its adoption in a newspaper of general circulation in the County.

Section 15. The existing County ORV Ordinance adopted by the Marquette County Board of Commissioners on [month] [date], 2025, shall be and hereby is repealed as of the effective date of this Ordinance.
