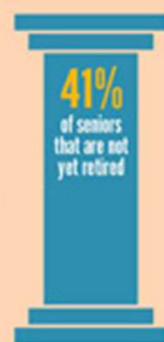

Starting in October of 2024 we received \$84,4493.00 from UPCAP strictly for our In home Services Program. In January of 2025 \$497,250.87 was allocated to us through our Marquette County Senior Services Millage. The remaining funds for our budget year of approximately 400,00 was covered by grants completed by staff, City of Marquette Senior Services Millage, donations and previous fund balance.
